Lesson 1: Introduction - What Makes a Great Church?

When people think of a great church, their minds often go to the building, the worship team, or the preacher's energy. While these are good, they are not the foundation of greatness in God's eyes. A great church is built upon God's Word, God's Spirit, and God's people living in obedience to His call.

Unfortunately, many people attend church week after week searching for answers but leave unchanged because the focus has shifted from God's plan to human traditions. Worse still, some reject Christ altogether because of the poor witness of hypocritical believers.



To restore God's vision of the church, we must return to three foundational passages that Jesus gave us:

The Great Call

Then He said to them all, "If anyone desires to come after Me, let him deny himself, and take up his cross daily, and follow Me.

Luke 9:23 NKJV

The Great Commandment

Jesus said to him, "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind.' This is the first and great commandment. And the second is like it: 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself.' On these two commandments hang all the Law and the Prophets."

Matthew 22:37-40 NKJV

The Great Commission

Go therefore and make disciples of all the nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all things that I have commanded you; and lo, I am with you always, even to the end of the age." Amen.

Matthew 28:19-20 NKJV

These three truths form the DNA of a great church. At Ekklesia, every program, ministry, and activity must flow from these commands. If it doesn't, we don't do it. If it does, we give it our all.

Lesson 2: The Purpose of the Church

Jesus made the mission of the church clear, but it can be summarized into five purposes. Each purpose is not optional, but essential, if we want to become the church God designed us to be.

Purpose #1: Worship (Exalt the Savior)

Worship is our first calling. We were created to love God with all our heart, soul, and mind. Worship is not just about music or singing but about expressing love and honor to God. Worship comes before service because all true ministry flows out of a heart that adores Him.

Purpose #2: Ministry (Equip the Saints)

The church exists to show God's love through service. Ministry is not only the pastor's job—it is the work of every believer. Jesus showed us that even the smallest act of kindness, like offering a cup of water, is ministry in His name.

Purpose #3: Evangelism (Evangelize the Lost)

The Great Commission calls every believer to share the Good News. Evangelism is not just the job of missionaries; it is the daily calling of all Christians. As we go about our lives, we carry the Gospel with us to neighbors, co-workers, and nations.



Purpose #4: Fellowship (Extend the Love of Christ)

Baptism is not only a sign of salvation but also a symbol of belonging. As members of God's family, we are called to community, not isolation. Fellowship is where believers find encouragement, accountability, and love.

Purpose #5: Discipleship (Be an Example of Christ)

The Christian journey doesn't end at salvation; it continues through lifelong growth. Discipleship means becoming more like Christ in thought, word, and deed. The church is called to help believers mature so they can help others grow too.

Lesson 3: Ekklesia's Purpose Statement

At Ekklesia, we summarize Christ's mission with five key words:

- Exalt: We celebrate God's presence in worship.
- Equip: We prepare God's family for fellowship and ministry.
- Evangelize: We share the Good News of Jesus.
- Extend: We demonstrate Christ's love through service and discipleship.
- **Example:** We live as visible reflections of Christ.

Our mission statement:

"We the Ekklesia – to Exalt the Savior, to Equip the Saints, to Evangelize the Lost, Extend the Love of Christ, and to be an Example of a Christ-led life."

This is more than words—it is a standard of living for every member.

Lesson 4: Living "Everyday... Ekklesia"

Our call is not to live out faith just on Sundays, but every day.

"Everyday... Ekklesia" means taking the Great Call, Great Commandment, and Great Commission and applying them in real, daily life.

That's why our motto is: "Each1, Reach1, Bring1, and together we'll TeachEvery1."



- Each1: Every believer is responsible for living their faith.
- Reach1: We are called to personally reach someone for Christ.
- Bring1: We bring others into fellowship with God and His church.
- TeachEvery1: Together, we disciple others so they too can live for Christ.

This is how we make disciples and grow the Kingdom. It's not about programs, it's about people—one life at a time.

Jesus has called us not only to believe but to go and make disciples (Matthew 28:19–20). A healthy and growing church doesn't happen by accident; it happens when God's people live intentionally, working together to reach the lost, disciple the found, and build the body of Christ.

Here are 15 practical, biblical strategies for growing as soul-winners and strengthening Ekklesia Christian Life Ministries.



1. Invite Everybody We Meet to Come to Church (Luke 14:15–24)

Jesus told the parable of the great banquet where the master commanded his servants to "go out quickly... and compel them to come in, so that my house will be full." A simple invitation can open the door for someone to encounter Christ.

2. Share a Personal Testimony (John 9)

The man healed of blindness didn't know every theological detail, but he boldly said, "One thing I know: I was blind but now I see!" Your story of how Jesus changed you is one of the most powerful evangelism tools you have.



3. Share What Ekklesia is All About (Matthew 28:19-20)

When people ask about your church, tell them more than the service times—share the mission. Explain that Ekklesia exists to exalt God, equip believers, evangelize the lost, extend Christ's love, and live as His example.

4. Participate in Praise Worship (Psalms 146-150)

A church that celebrates God in joyful praise creates an atmosphere where souls are drawn to Him. Singing with passion and freedom shows the world that our God is alive and worthy.



5. Become a Disciple Through Bible Study (2 Timothy 2:15)

A growing believer is a learning believer. When we study the Word, we prepare ourselves to answer questions, resist temptation, and disciple others.

6. Practice "Community Time" in Ministry (Matthew 5:14-16)

Jesus said we are the light of the world. By living out our faith in visible, practical ways—at work, in school, or in our ministries—we shine His light into dark places.



7. Participate in Fellowship and Activities (Hebrews 12:15)

Fellowship is more than socializing—it's spiritual encouragement. When we come together, we strengthen each other's faith, which in turn makes us stronger witnesses to the world.

8. Identify Your Spiritual Gifts (2 Timothy 1:6)

Every believer has a spiritual gift. When you know yours, you can serve with joy and power. Stir up the gift within you and use it to glorify God.



9. Serve in Ministries that Match Your Gifts (1 Corinthians 14)

When we serve where God has gifted us, ministry becomes fruitful instead of burdensome. Whether it's teaching, serving, giving, or leading—your gift has a place in building the church.

10. Progress Toward Christian Maturity (1 Corinthians 13:11; Ephesians 4:11–15)

Spiritual maturity is a journey. As we grow, we put away childish things and become stable, Christ-like disciples who can guide others.



- 11. Commit to Biblical Stewardship (Malachi 3:8–10; 2 Corinthians 9:6–8) Giving is worship. When we honor God with our tithes and offerings, He promises to pour out blessings and provide for His church's mission.
- 12. Build Relationships with the Unchurched (Luke 19:1–10)

Just like Jesus sought out Zacchaeus, we must intentionally build friendships with those who don't yet know Him. Real relationships open hearts for the Gospel.

13. Memorize Ekklesia's Vision and Purpose (Psalm 37:5)

Hide the mission in your heart so you can live it and share it. When every member knows the vision, the church moves forward in unity.

14. Pray Daily for the Church and Leaders (Matthew 26:41; 1 Thessalonians 5:25)

Prayer undergirds every part of the church. A praying church is a powerful church. Pray for your leaders, for souls to be saved, and for the strength of the body.

15. Participate in a Mission Project Each Year (Ephesians 4:16)

Every part of the body has a role. Whether it's local outreach, feeding the hungry, or overseas missions, involvement in Kingdom work strengthens both the individual and the church.
