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Our Time...

Daily Prayer and Devotion

Our TIME with GOD is vital. We must understand we can not experience the fullness of life without fully knowing God. God's desire is to establish a "personal relationship" with us.

He created us as individuals, forming us in the womb (Psalm 139:13). God knows the intimate details of our lives, such as the number of hairs on our heads (Luke 12:7). He knows the sparrows individually, and "you are worth more than many sparrows" (Matthew 10:29, 31). He invites us to come to Him and know Him (Isaiah 1:18; Revelation 22:17; Song of Solomon 4:8). When we desire to know God intimately, we will seek Him early (Psalm 63:1) and spend time with Him. We will be like Mary, sitting at Jesus' feet listening to His voice (Luke 10:39). We will hunger and thirst for righteousness, and we will be filled (Matthew 5:6).

Perhaps the best reason for us to invest time alone with God is to follow biblical examples. In the Old Testament, we see God call prophets to come to Him alone. Moses met with God alone at the burning bush and then on Mt. Sinai. David, whose many psalms reflect a confident familiarity with God, communed with Him while on the run from Saul (Psalm 57). God's presence passed by as Elijah was in the cave. In the New Testament, Jesus devoted time alone with God (Matthew 14:13; Mark 1:35; Mark 6:45-46; Mark 14:32-34; Luke 4:42; Luke 5:16; Luke 6:12; Luke 9:18; John 6:15).

Jesus actually instructed us to pray to God alone at times: "When you pray, go into your room, close the door and pray to your Father, who is unseen" (Matthew 6:6a).

To rely on Jesus as our vine (John 15:1-8), we will need to be directly, intimately connected to Him. Just as a branch is linked directly to the vine and, through the vine, connected to other branches, so we are linked directly to Christ and therefore share in a community. We share time alone with God and in corporate worship for the best nourishment. Without time alone with God, we will find needs unmet; we will not truly know the abundant life He gives.

Investing time alone with God rids our minds of distraction so that we can focus on Him and hear His Word. Abiding in Him, we enjoy the intimacy to which He calls us and come to truly know Him.

Our Talents...

Identifying and Implementing our Spiritual Gifts

Every believer has one or more spiritual gifts. These are gifts of God's grace, not something we earn or deserve. They are given by God according to His plan and decree, not by our pleading or desire. The gifts of the Spirit are listed in the Bible in six different places (1 Corinthians 12:8-10, 12:28, 29-30; Romans 12:6-8; Ephesians 4:11; 1 Peter 4:11). They are different from the fruit of the Spirit (Galatians 5:22-23). The fruit of the Spirit reflect our spiritual growth while the gifts do not (consider the church at Corinth which was exceedingly gifted but also exceedingly immature).

The gifts of the Spirit work with ministries of the church with the offices in the church they are: apostles, prophets, evangelists, pastors and teachers. The task of the ones in these offices is to equip God's people to do the work of God and build up the church. As God's people are being developed, they begin to realize there is something more... and the desire to seek God's face and identify our gifts and what we are to do with them begins.

What would be helpful in identifying and using your gifts?

Be patient. God will make your gifts clear in time as you faithfully serve others. Don't be overly concerned about what you are doing for God. He's far more concerned about what He's doing within you to make you more like Jesus Christ. Your character – who you are – is God's chief concern. Your conduct – what you do – also is important to Him, but in second place. Remember: what you do flows out of who you are – not the other way around.

What are the most important spiritual gifts?

Every spiritual gift is equally important and necessary to the functioning of the Church. "No part is important on its own. Can you imagine Eye telling Hand, 'Get lost; I don't need you'? Or, Head telling Foot, 'You're fired; your job has been phased out' (1 Corinthians 12:21 MSG). All the gifts are needed, and all the gifts are important.

What accountability exists for using your spiritual gifts? Someday you will stand before God and give an accounting of your life. In The Purpose Driven Life Rick Warren writes that God will ask you only two questions. First, "What did you do with my Son?" Your answer will clarify whether or not you accepted God's free gift of salvation through Christ. Finally, "What did you do with all I gave you [including spiritual gifts]?" Your answer will determine the quality of your service to Him, and therefore, your rewards in heaven.

Our Church, Our Community...

Now that you have identified some of you Gifts, let's put them to work in Our Church and Our Community

What is the Church?

The Church is not the building it's the people. Our church— Ekklesia is A "Called-Out" Family of Believers Reflecting the Image of Christ Jesus. We are a diverse group of believers coming together to build and encourage one another and build and encourage our community. We are to apply our God given gifts in the areas of need in our church and community. Giving back to our church and the community is giving to Christ.

There are many passages of scripture that best describes what the church is to be and do, two statements by Jesus summarize it all: the Great Commandment (Matt. 22:37-40) and the Great Commission (Matt. 28:19-20).

Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind... Love your neighbor as yourself. All the Law and the Prophets hang on these two commandments. Matthew 22:37-40

Go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. Matthew 28:19-20

In these two verses we find 5 ways to Give Back

- 1. Love the Lord with all your heart—Give back with Worship
- 2. Love your neighbor as yourself—Give back with Ministry
 - 3. Go and make disciples—Give back with Evangelism
 - 4. Baptizing them—Giving back with *Fellowship*
 - 5. Teaching them to obey—Giving back with *Discipleship*

Pray and ask God,

"Lord, now that you have helped me to see some of the gifts you have given me. please show me how to apply them according to you word and the need in my church and my community. Thank you. In the name of Jesus. Amen.

Ask your pastor, mentor, teacher, prayer partner to touch and agree with you and you begin this journey of giving back.

At Ekklesia we use four key words to summarize the 5 ways Christ prescribed giving back for his church.

- **Exalt**: We celebrate God's presence in worship
- Equip: We though God's Word prepare God's family for fellowship
- Evangelize: We communicate God's Word through evangelism
- **Extend**: We educate God's people and demonstrate God's love through discipleship and service

Our Treasure... His Tithe

What Does God's Word Say About The Tithe?

What is the tithe? It is the "gateway for the believer into the covenant of bless-ings." In the Hebrew "maaser" or "maasrah," is translated tenth, or tenth part, and in Greek "apodekatoo" and in both, it means a payment or giving or receiving of the tenth. The tithe is that tenth of our income that we give to God, which enables Him to move on our behalf in the area of blessings. The Bible records numerous accounts of man tithing to God. God is the creator of everything that exists. He owns everything and we are simply stewards of what we have been entrusted with. The tithe principle is this; "He gives unto us, we give back to Him one-tenth of all that He has blessed us with.

"Abraham tithed unto Melchizedek, Isaac tithed unto His son Jacob and many others also even before the law was given. Many Christians do not tithe because they have been taught that they are not under the law, but under grace. While this is a true statement, God did not institute the tithe to bring us under the law, but to get blessings to His children. Abraham tithed before the law, and God blessed him supernaturally. We're under grace that we might establish the law; not turn from it. Jesus said that He didn't come to do away with the law, but to fulfill it. Because He fulfilled it, we are to establish it. His Words are forever settled in heaven, therefore we establish His Words upon the earth.

Jesus put it like this... Matthew 5:17-19: "Think not that I am come to destroy the law, or the prophets: I am not come to destroy, but to fulfil. For verily I say unto you, Till heaven and earth pass, one jot or one tithe shall in no wise pass from the law, till all be fulfilled. Whosoever therefore shall break one of these least commandments, and shall teach men so, he shall be called the least in the kingdom of heaven: but whosoever shall do and teach them, the same shall be called great in the kingdom of heaven."

Tithing According to the Law as Given by Moses Leviticus 27:30 "And all the tithe of the land, whether of the seed of the land, or of the fruit of the tree, is the LORD'S: it is holy unto the LORD." This scripture states that all the tithe, whether it be seed of the land, fruit of the tree, or one tenth of all that you earn, is holy unto the Lord.

Deuteronomy 14:22-29 states that one-tenth of all that comes into your possession, belongs to God. This was God's plan to instruct His people as to the way of blessings that He had for them. God is a multiplier by nature, and He could not multiply that which was not entrusted to Him. When the children of Israel were obedient to give back to God that which was His, increase was guaranteed.

Scripture states, It's better to be obedient than to sacrifice. When the children of Israel were obedient, blessings came; when they were dis -obedient, they had to sacrifice. Many Chris-tians today are wanting God to honor the covenant that He has with His children, but disobedient children cannot receive the same reward as the obedient.

1 Samuel 15:22: "And Samuel said, Hath the LORD as great delight in burnt offerings and sacrifices, as in obeying the voice of the LORD? Behold, to obey is better than sacrifice, and to hearken than the fat of rams." The strongest chain is only as strong as its weakest link. When we fail to tithe, we be-come that weak link. Statistics show that approximately 20% of Christians tithe. That means, 80% is not in covenant with God.

It would be better to rob a bank than to rob the bank of Heaven. I'm sure most Christians don't see it this way. Malachi 3:8 asks the question "Will a man rob God? Yet ye have robbed me. But ye say, Wherein have we robbed thee? In tithes and offerings. Ye are cursed with a curse: for ye have robbed me, even this whole nation.

2 Corinthians 9:6-8: But this I say: He who sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and he who sows bountifully will also reap bountifully. So let each one give as he purposes in his heart, not grudgingly or of necessity; for God loves a cheerful giver.

Ekklesia (pronounced ek-klay-see'-ah) is The Greek word used in the Bible for church, which actually means "assembly" or literally "called out ones." It is made up of the two Greek words, EK—"out of," and KALEO— "shall be called."
