

ONE-DAY INTENSIVE COURSE

EVERYDAY EKKLESIA: EACH1 • REACH1 • BRING1 • TEACHEVERY1

Total Duration: 5.5 hours

Format: Teaching • Discussion • Activation • Reflection

Audience: New Members, Leaders, Ministry Workers, Discipleship Track

Outcome: Participants leave knowing **who they are, what the Church is, and what their personal assignment is.**

COURSE AGENDA (5–6 HOURS)

Hour 1 — Orientation & Vision

Session 1: What Is Ekklesia? (60 min)

 Key Scriptures: Luke 9:23; Matthew 22:37–40; Matthew 28:19–20

Objectives

- Understand “Ekklesia” as a *called-out, sent people*
- Establish the Great Call, Commandment, and Commission as the framework

Content

- Overview of “Everyday Ekklesia” (pp. 3–4)
- The Five Purposes of the Church (pp. 5–8)
- Ekklesia Purpose Statement

Activity

- Group reflection: “*Why did God save me AND place me in His Church?*”

Hour 2 — EACH1

Session 2: Taking Up Your Cross Daily (75 min)

 Luke 9:23

Objectives

- Define biblical discipleship
- Identify self-denial as daily obedience, not punishment

Content

- Exegesis of Luke 9:23 (pp. 9–14)
- Qualified by Grace
- Sanctified for Service
- Glorified in Christ

Activation

- Personal inventory: “*What must I deny to follow Christ fully?*”
- Prayer of surrender

Hour 3 — REACH1

Session 3: Loving God and Neighbor (60 min)

 Matthew 22:37–40

Objectives

- Connect love to discipleship
- Move love from theory to practice

Content

- Love as fulfillment of the Law (pp. 15–19)

- Worship, Ministry, and Community engagement

Group Exercise

- Case studies: Loving difficult neighbors, coworkers, family
- “Love Map” – where God has placed you

Hour 4 — BRING1

Session 4: Who Can I Bring to Jesus? (75 min)

 John 1:40–42; John 6:8–9; John 12:20–22

Objectives

- Learn relational evangelism
- Remove fear from soul-winning

Content

- Andrew’s model of bringing people to Jesus (pp. 20–30)
- Seeing potential in others
- Sharing testimony
- Intentional relationships

Activation

- Write down 3 names God is placing on your heart
- Practice sharing a 2-minute testimony

Hour 5 — TOGETHER & TEACHEVERY1

Session 5: Power of One & Teaching Together (60 min)

 Ephesians 4:1–16; Romans 12:4–8

Objectives

- Understand unity and function
- See teaching as everyone's responsibility

Content

- Power of One (pp. 31–32)
- Teaching 'together' in Ekklesia (pp. 33–35)
- Review: EACH1 • REACH1 • BRING1 • TEACHEVERY1

Group Commitment

- Ministry alignment
- Mentoring and discipleship pathways

Final Activation (30 min)

Commissioning & Prayer

- Review the 15 Soul-Winning Strategies (p. 35)
- Corporate prayer
- Personal action commitments

TEACHER'S MANUAL (FACILITATOR GUIDE)

1. PRE-COURSE PREPARATION

- Read entire workbook once
- Pray over participants by name
- Prepare:
 - Whiteboard or flip chart
 - Printed participant worksheets
 - Name tags

2. TEACHING NOTES (PER SESSION)

Each session should include:

A. Teaching Focus

- Key scripture
- One main truth (repeat often)

B. Teaching Tips

- Keep tone pastoral and prophetic
- Invite testimonies but manage time
- Emphasize *obedience over information*

C. Discussion Prompts

- Use workbook questions

- Encourage honesty, not performance

D. Common Challenges

- Fear of evangelism
- Guilt-based discipleship
- Confusion between church attendance and church identity

3. TIME MANAGEMENT GUIDE

- Teach 30–40 min per session
- Discussion 15–20 min
- Activation 10–15 min

4. FACILITATOR LANGUAGE (KEY PHRASES)

- “This is not about perfection, it’s about obedience.”
- “Discipleship is daily, not seasonal.”
- “You don’t bring people to church — you bring them to Jesus.”
- “The Church doesn’t grow by addition, but by activation.”

5. POST-COURSE FOLLOW-UP

- Assign participants to:
 - Small groups

- Mentorship tracks
- Ministry teams
- Encourage completion of:
 - Baptism
 - Discipleship classes
 - Service alignment
