The Power of Thanking God for What's Next

We often thank God for what He's done, but faith matures when we start thanking Him for what He's about to do.
Gratitude for the future shifts our mindset from fear to expectancy.

"Expectancy is gratitude on its tiptoes."

What Paul Was Saying in Philippians 1:6

- Paul wrote these words while in prison yet his faith was free.
- He reminds believers that God finishes what He starts.
- Expectancy isn't built on circumstances; it's built on confidence in Christ.

"Don't lose hope mid-story — the Author is still writing."

EXPECTANCY: WHAT IT LOOKS AND SOUNDS LIKE THE POSTURE OF FAITH

Looks Like:

- Seeing Spiritually
- Peace in a Storm Faith in Motion
- Hope in Hard Times

Sounds Like:

- Praise Before the Breakthrough
- Gratitude Before Provision

"Expectancy has a look and a sound you can see it and you can hear it!"

Seeing Spiritually

Expectancy Looks Like Seeing Spiritually

Just because you don't see it physically doesn't mean God isn't shaping it spiritually.

"I may not see it, but I sense it."

Listening and Speaking by Faith

Expectancy Sounds Like Faith in Motion

Expectancy speaks and moves — it prepares in advance.

"I'm living like what God promised is already on the way."

Peace in the Storm

Expectancy Looks Like Peace in a Storm

"I refuse to panic — I trust God's plan."

"You will keep in perfect peace all who trust in You."

Praising Before the Breakthrough

Expectancy Sounds Like Praise Before the Promise

Praise is proof of expectation — it's gratitude in motion.

"I will praise Him NOW for what I believe He is about to do NEXT."

Faith in Action Thank Him in Advance — Live in Expectation

Gratitude in advance is faith in motion.

- You clean the room before the blessing.
- You build the crib before the baby.
- You sharpen your gift before the door opens.

Faith doesn't wait to move — it prepares to receive.

Ekklesia Declaration of Expectancy I will thank God for my future! I will not wait to see it — I will praise until I walk in it.

God is not finished with me yet, and what's coming is greater than what's been.

My eyes haven't seen it, my ears haven't heard it, but my spirit expects it — and I thank God in advance!
